WFO Fugitive Named to FBI's Ten Most Wanted List

Earlier this month the FBI announced the addition of <u>Listin Toth</u>, aka David Bussone, to our "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives" list. Toth, a former Washington, DC, private school teacher and camp counselor, is being sought for his alleged production and possession of child pornography. The investigation into Toth began in June 2008, after pornographic images were found on a school camera that had been in his possession. Toth has often been described as a computer "expert" and has demonstrated an above-average knowledge regarding computers, the use of the Internet, and security awareness. He has the ability to integrate into various socio-



economic classes, and is an expert at social engineering. Toth possesses an educational background conducive to gaining employment in fields having a connection to children. He attended Cornell University for a year and then transferred to Purdue University where he graduated with a degree in education. He may advertise online as a tutor or male nanny. Despite being featured on multiple local news reports as well as the America's Most Wanted television program and the FBI web site, Toth has eluded capture. Since June 2008, Toth is believed to have travelled to Illinois, Indiana, Wisconsin and Minnesota. It is also believed that he lived in Arizona as recently as 2009. Toth is 6'3" and weighs approximately 155 pounds with brown hair, green eyes and a medium complexion. He also has a mole under his left eye. Toth is the 495th person to be placed on the FBI's Ten Most Wanted Fugitives list, which was established in 1950. Former Senate Office Manager Sentenced to 20 Months in Prison for Wire Fraud

Last month, Ngozi Pole, a former office manager in the U.S. Senate, was sentenced to 20 months in prison for wire fraud and theft of government property. Beginning in at least 2003 and continuing until January 2007, Pole repeatedly submitted paperwork causing the Senate to pay him larger bonus payments than had been approved by either the chief of staff or former U.S. Senator Edward Kennedy. These unauthorized bonus payments totaled more than \$75,000. Pole hid these unauthorized payments by repeatedly transmitting information to the chief of staff that falsely showed that he received only those payments that had been authorized. In addition to his prision term, Pole must serve three years of supervised release, complete 500 hours of community service, and pay \$77,608.86 in restitution.

Members of Crips Gang Accused of Prostituting High School Girls

Five members of the Underground Gangster Crips (UGC) gang, based in Fairfax County, Va., were arrested last month for allegedly running a prostitution business that recruited high school girls and threatened them with violence if they attempted to leave. Justin Strom, the leader of the UGC within Fairfax County, would allegedly contact teens at school or through Facebook, DateHookUp.com, and other online social networking sites and entice the girls to use their good looks to earn money through prostitution. In addition, UGC members would approach girls at bus or rail stops and attempt to recruit them into joining their prostitution business. Once a girl expressed interest, Strom is alleged to have relied on her to earn money for UGC members by having sex with multiple clients. Strom has been indicted on 10 counts related to juvenile prostitution while two UGC members have pled guilty to sex trafficking of a juvenile, and two other members await court dates. Since 2011, eleven area gang members have been charged with underage sex trafficking as part of ongoing investigations.
