FLEYA - Frequently Asked Questions

- Q?** **Is there any charge for the FLEYA program?**
Answer: No, FLEYA is free of charge to those accepted into the program. Students will be housed on the Yale University Campus. Students will be asked to provide Khaki color pants and black shoes as part of the uniform. *There may be a minimal charge for FLEYA uniform polo shirt.
- Q?** **Is the program only for high school students?**
Answer: The program has been designed for high school students ages 16 – 18 that have at least one academic year of high school remaining. This enables students to share the information they have learned and serve as peer mentors for the program, when appropriate.
- Q?** **Does a student have to have specific experience in law enforcement to be a successful candidate (i.e. ROTC, Police Explorers)?**
Answer: No, the program is designed for students that are seeking clarity on a career in law enforcement or the legal field.
- Q?** **Can an accepted student into the program leave campus to work or attend school sporting events?**
Answer: No. Once a student is part of the accepted FLEYA class, they are to remain on campus, under supervision of program chaperones, for the duration of the week-long program. Additionally, students are not permitted to have visitors during the week.
- Q?** **Is the application essay required?**
Answer: Yes, the essay is required as it is the first element of the application reviewed by our panelists. The essay will allow an opportunity for the student to highlight their understanding of current event issues and leadership.
- **Essay must be typed with proper punctuation and capitalization.**
 - **Essay must be typed in the space allotted in the application. If you are unable to do so, essay may be submitted as an attachment. Please include your name on each page if submitted as an attachment.**
 - **Any attachments must be in Word or PDF format; NO Google docs or password-required programs.**
