
KEVIN BRAME

Murder Victim Dayton, Ohio November 1, 1999







REWARD

The FBI is offering a reward of up to \$15,000 for information leading to the arrest of a suspect or suspects involved in the murder of Dayton Police Officer Kevin Brame.

DETAILS

On November 1, 1999, Kevin Brame, a 6-year-veteran of the Dayton Police Department, was murdered in front of 624 Cherry Drive, Dayton, Ohio. He was returning his two children to his estranged wife after a visitation. Brame was ambushed and fatally shot one time in the neck by an unknown suspect or suspects as he attempted to enter his vehicle which was parked in the driveway of the residence. Brame was found to be in possession of his service weapon and belongings, suggesting it was not a robbery.
