



**ViCAP ALERT:
UNIDENTIFIED HOMICIDE VICTIM**

Attention: Homicide, Missing Persons, Sex Crimes and Crime Analysis Units



On May 28, 1992, the remains of an unidentified female, “Jane Doe”, were found in the desert near the Central Arizona Project Canal near Deer Valley Road and 20th Street in Phoenix, Arizona. She could have been in the desert 4-8 weeks, but not more than 6 months.

Race: White
Sex: Female

Age: 11 – 18 years
Hair: Brown

Height: 5’1” – 5’3”
Weight: 105 – 125 lbs

Distinguishing Characteristics: Dental: Her teeth were well cared for. She still had some of her baby teeth with no adult teeth under them, which was uncommon per the forensic odontologist.

Clothes/Jewelry/Possessions: Black bow was in her hair. Victim was wearing a multicolored floral pattern long sleeve shirt, black pants, blue socks, and brown shoes.

Details of Discovery: An anonymous man had been riding an ATV in the desert near the canal when he discovered the decomposed body. A year later police learned his identity and he informed police he had found a pair of prescription eyeglasses near the body at the time of discovery. The glasses were in good shape, appeared clean, with plastic frames and thick lenses. It is unknown if the eyeglasses belonged to the female victim or some other female. At that time, the area of the desert was used by people riding all terrain vehicles, and also by people illegally dumping trash in the desert.
